

# Lake tour Salzkammergut along R2, start in Bad Ischl

cycling from Bad Ischl to Salzburg and back

This cycle tour really has a lot to offer: the sporting adventure and cultural and historic highlights make your holiday an unforgettable experience. Our tour takes you through parts of the Salzkammergut and the Mozart town Salzburg in seven days.

# The course of your cycling tour:

## Day 1: Individual arrival in Bad Ischl.

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You will receive your detailed travel documents at your accommodation.

Overnight stay in a \*\*\*\* hotel at Bad Ischl.

## Day 2: Bad Ischl – Thalgau

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~47 km, altitude difference ascent 535 m / descent 467 m

The cycle path starts in Bad Ischl, goes through Pfandl - Radau to St. Wolfgang - with the boat from St. Wolfgang to the Mozart village St. Gilgen - over the Scharfling and past the Krottensee and to Lake Mondsee. Continue on to Thalgau.

Overnight stay in Thalgau.

## Day 3: Thalgau – Seekirchen

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~48 km, altitude difference ascent 438 m / descent 467 m

From Thalgau via Lake Mondsee to Lake Irrsee along the cycle path - the path takes you to the end of the lake in Oberhofen along the left shore - branch off to Neumarkt - around the Wallersee to Seekirchen.

Overnight stay at Lake Wallersee.

## Day 4: Lake Wallersee – Seeham

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~23 km, altitude difference ascent 157 m / descent 155 m

From Lake Wallersee past Kostendorf to Schleedorf - further to Lake Mattsee - Lake Obertrumsee/Mattsee circular tour - to Seeham.

Overnight stay at the Lake Obertrumer See.

## Day 5: Seeham – Hallein - Salzburg

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~70 km, altitude difference ascent 451 m / descent 551 m

From Seeham past Nußdorf to Oberndorf - Quiet Night Chapel - along the river Salzach on the Mozart cycle path to Salzburg and further along the river to Hallein. The historical city of salt- and celtic is definitely worth visiting. You cycle back to Salzburg along the river Salzach.

Overnight stay in Salzburg.

## Day 6: Salzburg – Thalgau

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~24 km, altitude difference ascent 346 m / descent 220 m

The today's journey leads you along the former railway Ischler Bahn line past Eugendorf and to Thalgau.

Overnight stay in Thalgau.

## Day 7: Thalgau – Bad Ischl

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~44 km, altitude difference ascent 648 m / descent 701 m

From Thalgau - through the forest to St. Lorenz at Lake Mondsee - back to Lake Wolfgangsee over the Scharfling pass (short ascent on high-pass Scharflingpass) - lake side cycle path to Strobl - through Lindau back to Ischl

Overnight stay in a \*\*\*\* hotel in Bad Ischl

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## GENERAL INFORMATION:

The cycle tours don't have any technical difficulties, there are only very few ascents! A reasonable fitness level is necessary to enjoy this trip as well as cycle equipment like sneakers, rucksack, sun- and rain protection, comfortable sports cloths, jacket, jumper, and so on. The routes are suited for trekking bikes - mostly they are asphalted cycle paths, a few stretches are gravel and forest paths. Should you want to spend a quiet day, you can cover most distances by public transport like bus, train or boat.

### **Accommodation:**

Twin-bedded rooms in Austrian resorts are normally one large base with two mattresses/duvets. These are also known as 'Austrian Twins' and are regarded as two beds. Separate twin beds are rare and cannot be guaranteed as available.

Location of the accommodation are mainly close to the trails.

### **Information for arrivals by car:**

The parking place does not always situate next to the accommodation but on a public parking place.
